Under these circumstances horary offers a very powerful astrological tool, not only for revealing the outcome or solution to a problem, but also for demonstrating its origin and cause, and what route should be taken to avoid repetition and ensure a full resolution.

This one day workshop will introduce and illuminate the most pertinent techniques of horary through practical demonstrations of modern client charts covering a variety of typical horary themes. From the heart-breaking to the hilarious, and from the obviously emotional to the apparently mundane, the examples show why horary is a necessary tool for every modern astrologer, being simple enough to be of immediate practical value, yet powerful enough to change the lives of those who are trapped in cycles of despair.
